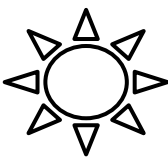

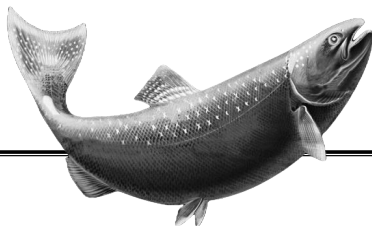

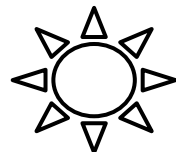
Priority Habitat & Species:

Energy-Saving & Environmental Tips

Summers have been getting warmer up here in Washington state, so here are some great ideas to be more energy-efficient and keep excess heat out of your home:

- Window coverings, ie. awnings, blinds, solar screens, etc.
- Fans in the bathrooms and kitchen that vent heat and humidity to the outdoors
- Plant trees and bushes to create more shade around your home
- Add weatherstripping around all doors

Our pollinators - bees, butterflies, moths, birds, bats, and insects - are disappearing at a startling rate due to overuse of pesticides, diseases, and loss of habitat. We can help them by providing water and areas of our yards that are left natural. Native plants of different colors and sizes, such as long tubular flowers like Lupine, Honeysuckle, and Pentstemon are among many that they love to eat. Other native plants that benefit them are Elderberry, Thimbleberry, Salmonberry, Ocean Spray, Fringe Cup, and more. Get out and enjoy the beauty of nature in your own backyard and know that you are doing your part to help our pollinators!
