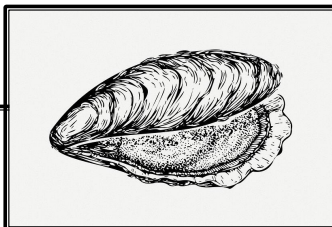
Think Safety!

Priority Habitat & Species:
Pacific Oyster

The large, bivalve mollusk helps to stabilize sediment, improve water quality, and are an important estuarine species. They can live up to 30 years, fertilize externally, and feed on phytoplankton. Wanna know more about this abundant Hood Canal wildlife?

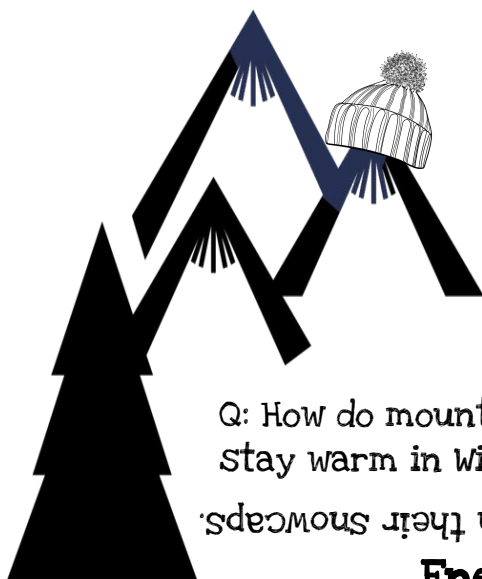


EBCC Fun Fact

The portable toilet placed at the park is provided as a service to the many drivers who deliver goods and necessities to our EBCC residents.



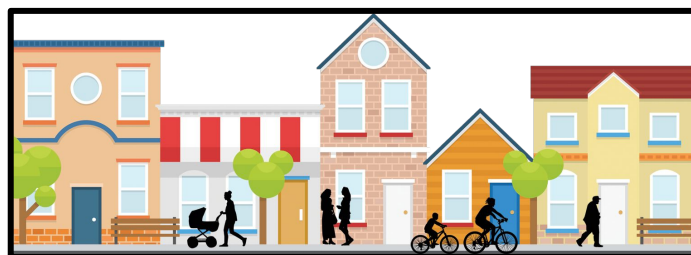

Energy-Saving & Environmental Tips

- Power outdoor lights by using lower lumen ("warmer") bulbs to save on electricity - 800 lumens or less
- Insulate pipes
- Plug exterior vent grates, ie. use foam blocks
- Close the damper when not using the fireplace
- Lower the thermostat by 10-15 degrees while sleeping at night
- Ensure furnace filters are clean

Avian Bird Flu



- Keep feeders and feeder areas clean
- Do not touch a dead bird or other wild animal
- Report any dead birds found at the beach to the caretaker and to the Department of Wildlife
